
Compendium Overview

Programs and services for survivors has also increased


BUT

The Process



Data collected and organized

Websites found through lists/publications/materials created by other scholars, field experts, and organizations



Data coded by thematic frameworks

Selections of organization's websites grouped into all applicable displayed narratives



Results interpreted

Overarching themes, demographic differences, and other findings explored, My lived experience and its effects on the research and interpretation of findings are considered



Overarching Themes



Power Dynamics/Influences

Multi-level

Should be critically examined and reflected upon, including social/economic/political factors



Critical Examination of Presentation

Whose voices are being represented? What dominant narratives are being projected by those who serve a vulnerable population?



Reverberating Effects

Maintenance or dissolution of status quo

What effects do the dominant narratives have on an individual, organizational, and community+ scale?
